Marla showed her "Temperature" calendar format quilt she has been working on for a few years. It is hand sewn and quilted and depicts the high and low temperatures in Sequim, in 2021. Marla also had a smaller version of this quilt from scraps she had left over.

Sue Gale showed a small wall hanging from the Improvisational Curves class she took with Barbara Ramsey. Sue also had a wall hanging of a Ginkgo tree inspired from a greeting card.
